- No. of passengers increased 30% since start of operations in 2010





Supplemental Environmental Analysis: Responded to public comments on draft SEIS/EIR; coordinated with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in preparation for TJPA Board approval in early 2017

Phase 2 Cost Estimate: Updated construction cost estimate to current market rates; incorporated MTC's recommendations

Phase 2 Next Steps: Presented update to the Board in June 2016; working with partners to secure funding to advance Phase 2 to 30%

Railyard Alternatives and I-280 Boulevard Feasibility Study: Continued to partner with City and provide technical background to the RAB study team

**Stakeholder Coordination:** Continued to coordinate with California High-Speed Rail Authority & Caltrans







### 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Funding

- Sale of Parcel F allowed for repayment of bridge loan in full
- City and MTC approval of short term financing to fully fund Phase 1 budget
- Received first TIFIA disbursement
- MTC & ABAG reaffirmed DTX as a regional priority in Plan Bay Area and increased regional commitment



### Plan for 2017 Funding

- Continue to seek discretionary funding from US Department of Transportation, US Department of Homeland Security, and State of California, decreasing amount of financing used
- Continue to seek full funding for Phase 2 DTX
  - Work with local funding partners to obtain local funding commitment as part of the New Starts Funding Plan
- Seek additional funding for Transit Center operations and maintenance

- 10-day look-ahead email updates to neighbors on a weekly basis
- Staffed 24-hour construction hotline
- Continued with regular newsletters and social media to highlight project components and milestones
- Over 80 tours to schools, business groups, media, professional/trade associations, funding partners, government officials, and other interested parties

### 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Community Outreach

- Ongoing communications to neighbors regarding final concrete pours, completion of steel assembly, awning placement, and temporary bridge removal
- Targeted outreach to residents and property managers along the Bus Ramp corridor
- Targeted outreach to residents regarding night work for Bus Ramp construction and bridge removal
- Worked closely with neighbors to help mitigate construction impacts, resulting in fewest complaints of any year since construction began:

2011 (6 months): 104 complaints 2012 (12 months): 78 complaints 2013 (12 months): 56 complaints 2014 (12 months): 43 complaints 2015 (12 months): 68 complaints 2016 (12 months): 41 complaints







### 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction — Transit Center



- All Structural Steel erection was completed in January with welding and metal decks by end of April
- All Below Grade Concrete walls and decks completed in 2016
- All Superstructure Concrete placement on Transit Center's last metal decks and the train box lid were completed in November
- Bus Deck concrete drive aisle and commuter island area topping slabs are now 75% complete in December
- Spray-on fireproofing at all levels was completed in 2016



### 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction — Transit Center



- W-1 Exterior Awning started in April 2016 and continues into April 2017
- W-2 and W-3 Glass Curtain Wall glazing started early 2016 and continues into 2017
- W-4 Glass Curtain Wall framing started at the roof oculus; W-4 completed including glazing at the Bus Deck in late 2016



- W-8 Rooftop glass canopy framing started in late 2016
- W-10 Rooftop glass skylights (3) framing completed in late 2016
- W-12 Rooftop glass floor framing and glazing completed in late 2016




# 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction – Transit Center

- Plumbing, mechanical, HVAC and electrical conduit installation made great progress throughout 2016
- Concrete wall and curb placement and CMU wall placement continued, nearing 95% complete in late 2016
- Wall framing and gypsum wall board started and made good progress in 2016
- Stair installation framing, landings and railings continued making good progress in 2016






# 2016 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction – Bus Ramp

- Completed all Bus Ramp concrete viaducts from the Bay Bridge to the Transit Center including the bus turnaround
- Completed the cable-stayed bridge with all cables installed by early November 2016
- Fabrication & installation of Frame 5 "Steel Span" connection to Transit Center will complete in February 2017
- Completed majority of all MSE and retaining walls in 2016 including backfill
